Drawing from Gertrude Stein's novel Ida, Kearney's own Ida is both a real and imagined other: a borrowing, a projection, a decoy. Here, the theatre of longing is a theatre of language, where the distances embedded in our relationships, not only with others, but with ourselves, circle around and proliferate a wound.

Improvisational, speculative, painterly, queer — if MyIda were less free it would be philosophy.


