Sibyl Kempson Invisible Horizon: A Religious Pamphlet


12 Shouts to the Ten Forgotten Heavens was a three-year performance project at the Whitney Museum of American Art by playwright, director, and performer Sibyl Kempson and her company, 7 Daughters of Eve Thtr. & Perf. Co. The project began in March 2016, on the Vernal Equinox, unfolding on each solstic and equinox until its end in December 2018, on the Winter Solstice. As a whole, it represents a submission to a ritual cycle—of the breathing process of the Earth, its days and seasons; and of human presence and interaction. This pamphlet is an experiential record of the making of this project.
